Enclosed are comments on transmission files 3077 and 3078.

I have general comment on the mixing of data from different experiments and from different references in the same entry.

According to EXFOR coding rules the main reference should always be given first. First, for machine automation purposes, has been taken to mean the first reference in subentry one, if one exists. If not, then the first reference in the data subentry.

Therefore, if the main reference is coded in a subentry, all the references should be given in the subentries to avoid confusion.

Also, of course, any references in subentry one should always pertain to every data set.
