Subject: CINDA book publication

In 1989 a new CINDA archival issue should be published. This memo discusses 2 options and gives page number and price estimates.

The presently valid CINDA books are:

Archival issues

CINDA-A (contains references 1935-1976), 2 volumes, publ. in 1979  
1929 pages with appr. 116 000 entries

CINDA-B (contains references 1977-1981) publ. in 1984  
719 pages with appr. 47 000 entries

Current issues

CINDA 87 (contains references 1982-1987), publ. in 1987  
551 pages with appr. 35 000 entries

CINDA 87 Supplement publ. in 1987  
ca. 100 pages with appr. 5000 entries.

The current issue (e.g. CINDA 87) is cumulative containing all additions and changes for references since the cutoff of CINDA-B. Consequently, CINDA 88 will contain all of CINDA 87 plus the new and revised entries added since then, minus deleted entries. The current issue, therefore, gets thicker from year to year.

Traditionally, a new archival issue would have to be published as follows:

CINDA-C (contains references 1982-1986) to be publ. in 1989  
with probably 38 000 entries on 620 pages.

(The reason, why the archival issue with entries up to 1986 can be published only in 1989 is, that it needs some time for consolidation: adding of EXFOR index lines, blocking, removal of superseded references).

This traditional solution has two disadvantages:

- the user has to look up a whole series of books (2 vols. of CINDA-A, CINDA-B, CINDA-C, CINDA 89, CINDA 89 Suppl.) to obtain full information on a given topic,
- meanwhile many revisions (corrections, additions, removal of superseded references) have been done to old entries after the publication of CINDA-A and CINDA-B. These revisions do not show up in CINDA books but can be seen only in CINDA computer retrievals.

As most CINDA users prefer to have full information in the convenient form of handbooks (i.e. CINDA computer retrievals are not popular!), it has been suggested to publish a new complete archival issue:

CINDA-A (new) (containing references 1935-1986)  
to be publ. in 1989  
with appr. close to 200 000 records which can be  
published on 3200 pages in 3 (or 4) volumes, e.g.

vol. 1 A = 1-35  
vol. 2 A = 36-71  
vol. 3 A = 72-end

The publication costs for 1989 can be estimated as follows:

Solution C:

CINDA-C	ca. 620 pages+80*	= 700
CINDA 89	ca. 240 pages+80*	= 320
CINDA 89 Suppl.	ca. 110 pages+30*	= 140

\* the additional pages relate to the introductory text and explanatory tables of codes for the abbreviations of references and laboratories

**Solution A:** CINDA 89 is cumulative containing all additions and changes for teleconferencing since the cutoff of CINDA 88. CINDA 89 plus the new and CINDA 89 Suppl. as above = 140

Traditionally, a new arrival total 3740 pages to be published as follows:

CINDA is primarily financed by the bulk orders from NNDC and NEA-DB, and they should come to a conclusion. The IAEA publications committee would probably agree to the decision reached by NNDC and NEA-DB. But of course, as the new CINDA-A is a major workload for the printing shop, this must be budgeted and planned in advance. To avoid a too big workload at once, the three (or four) volumes of CINDA-A (new) could perhaps be printed in some intervals, and also the financing could be stretched over consecutive years, if necessary.

At present, the Agency prints 1240 copies of the current CINDA issues. The distribution is as follows:

- 400 copies = bulk order NEA
  - 300 copies = bulk order NNDC
  - 180 copies = individual sales
  - 150 copies = free copies to developing countries
  - 120 copies = 1 free copy per member state
  - 90 copies = internal use plus copies on stock
